- Jane Clary of Wright Water Engineers reviewed the data and QA/QC submittal requirements for the 2016 Water Monitoring Plan. The group discussed the content of the Executive Summary and the continued focus on E. coli, Nutrients and Arsenic and Selenium. Janice Lopitz will follow up with Julie McKay on watershed coalition efforts as well as with the Boulder County's Open Space. Supplying photographs would be beneficial. A summary on CDPHE efforts was requested. Dave Rees may not have the macroinvertebrate data compiled by the June 6 presentation but the group decided to hold that date. Lafayette will submit their E.coli special study.
- UDFCD E. coli survey The needs survey was discussed and Janice Lopitz will resend it to the group.

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- MS4 CDPHE Annual Report review nothing is required to be submitted for the second half of the year as the programs have not yet been implemented.
- GIS request from CDOT Boulder County would also like the data Scott Coulson will send request and a ftp site.
- H2O Jo collateral a request has been made of the CDPHE NPS program to edit the past files into contemporary graphics software.
- National Atmospheric Deposition Program CO85 site will be located at the Skywatch Observatory at the CU SEEC facility at Foothills and Colorado on December 15, 2016.
- The CSU <u>CLEAN Center</u> and <u>Colorado Monitoring Framework</u> have partnered to jointly host the annual Colorado Nutrient Management Workshop scheduled for <u>Thursday March 2, 2017.</u>
- The Colorado Water Conservation Board recently approved a new budget of \$25 million annually over the next few years for implementation. This budget includes funding for water conservation to help reach our state goal of saving 400,000

acre-feet of water, which would reduce water use by approximately 1 percent per year. The budget advances cost-effective measures to help communities make the most of every drop, like fixing leaky infrastructure and increasing water reuse technologies. Also included: \$5 million annually for stream management and watershed restoration plans — essential for both healthy ecosystems and our thriving recreational economy.
