#### **II. Coordinator and Partner Updates**

General updates:

- MS4 Permit – to be released on April 15th. June 1<sup>st</sup> CDPHE will host a meeting to discuss the changes. KICP agreed to bring ‘issues/questions’ to the May Steering Committee meeting.
- Watershed data - the group committed to QA/QCing the data by Friday April 8th.
- *E. coli* Tool box – UDFCD has worked with Wright Water to draft a CO specific document. Janice Lopitz has reviewed and suggested existing text from the document that could be use in an executive summary.
- Statewide LLYLI/CSC campaign – Colorado Water Conservation Board asked that the grant application be withdrawn for the \$200,000 for a statewide campaign. The Colorado Stormwater is currently discussing how to address the \$32,000 that the basin roundtables committed since the additional 200K is not available. The Council plans to move forward with implementing a campaign on buses across the state.
- May 10 watershed monitoring report out – The meeting is scheduled and presenters have been recruited. Jane Clary will be the focus.
- Watershed group formation and timing discussion – the group again discussed next steps to defining a watershed group. Bret shared the Bureau of Reclamation grant opportunity and indicated that having to pass a council resolution was a barrier to going forward. The group generally indicated the interest is still strong in researching the formation but recognized that the permit is about to be released so the timing may not be optimal. The wish list will be revisited.
- Remand Rule – 70 comments were submitted.
- March 21 CDPHE Water Quality Forum update
  - Denver administration building – One Water – the building is being modeled after buildings in Portland and San Francisco.
  - Metro’s Phosphorus Initiative –

- “Simple” online applications will be signature compliant (construction and ground water dewatering will be the first applications to us the online system)
- Basic Standards going forward – temperature. City of Boulder will be sending in comments in support of the Division’s proposal.
- Fee bill will be submitted next year – however, construction permit fees will begin to be based on acreage beginning in July.
- A revised NOI form for the industrial permittees has been complete by the Division.
- E. coli source tracking is a possible special project to be discussed during the KICP monitoring plan report out.
- The City of Boulder is hosting a 404 training with ERO.
- Janice Lopitz has been invited to meet with ditch district representatives to discuss runoff issues.
- Janice Lopitz has been invited to the Left Hand and St. Vrain Conservancy District to present the St. Vrain Watershed Plan.
- The revised KICP Plan is posted on the password protected site.
- Discussed that post-construction outreach has been reduced as City of Boulder isn’t targeting HOAs with speaker’s events and PACE isn’t reaching property managers any longer. The new permit will provide direction for the individual partner’s oversight. The structural BMP guidance document is on the website for everyone’s use to support their efforts.
