II. Coordinator and Partner Updates

General updates:

- LLYLI bus ads are complete and have been submitted to RTD
- The Colorado Stormwater Council is revamping their website
- The County Sustainability Team is adding water quality images and content to their website
- The Colorado Ocean Coalition has asked Janice Lopitz to sit on the board and to participant in the Waterkeeper group they have just formed. Janice will provide advice to the water sampling stream teams which they hope to form. Geocaching will also be a component.
- Glenn Paterson initially reported the flow for LeftHand had peaked – however, he flowed up with another email saying diversions may have lowered the flow.
- MS4 Permit discussion
 - Meeting with CDPHE was held on June 1 the minor and major modifications, factsheet and Q&A were discussed within one hour. The certifications and annual report form should be distributed soon.
 - Irrigation ditches – publically owned and majority stormwater – the mapping compliance deadline was modified and then removed. A decision tree has been development by the Colorado Stormwater Council and will be sent to the CDPHE for review.
 - Adjacent to state waters language remains in the permit.
 - PDD – to be fully implemented January 1, 2019.

 - PFA contamination in El Paso
 - Gold King – realtime flow monitoring and volunteer monitoring.
 - 63 CO systems exceeded Pb
 - Colorado Water Plan and WQCD strategy – public outreach, quantity, quality, and land use
 - John Stulp – water czar to governor – interagency coordination
 - Construction permit release postponed. 5 vacancies to be filled.
 - Fee meetings going forward – website has a calculator. One of the proposals would allocate a 27% reduction in MS4 fees.
