Housing

- Boulder County Housing 303-441-3929
Provides affordable housing opportunities to County residents. Services include affordable rentals, a rent subsidy program that assists eligible low-income persons and their families by paying a portion of their rent, and senior housing.
- Casa de la Esperanza 303-678-6220
A 32-unit residential community dedicated to helping agricultural workers. The Center provides educational and recreational services to Casa residents, including an onsite "after-school" program and academic center.
- Helios Station Housing 303-666-4348
Apartments with subsidized rent options for the low-income population.
- Boulder Shelter for the Homeless 303-442-4646
Clients have safe overnight shelter, food and support services. Services include dinner, breakfast, a safe place to sleep, storage space for personal belongings, phone and mail services, access to showers and laundry facilities, and meetings with case managers are all provided free of charge.
- Longmont Housing Authority 303-651-8443
Provides housing and related services to low and moderate income families, elderly and disabled households and to relieve the community of substandard housing.
- Senior Housing Options 303-441-3148
Currently own and/or manage both assisted living and subsidized apartment units for over 500 residents including Longmont.
- San Juan del Centro 303-441-0532
A multi-family housing complex in Boulder that includes on-site management, police annex, and The Family Learning Center. The neighborhood has a broad mix of ethnicity and age but is primarily home to families with small children.
- Youth Hostel 303-442-0522
An independent hostel offering dorm (shared) rooms and private rooms for travelers on a budget. They also offer temporary housing with weekly and 4-weekly rates.
