Domestic abuse is a pattern of behavior in a relationship that is used to gain power and control over another individual:

- Name calling
- Humiliation
- Threats and coercion
- Intimidation through looks, actions, and gestures
- Destruction of property
- Pet abuse
- Physical violence
- Controlling what you do, who you see, and who you talk to
