









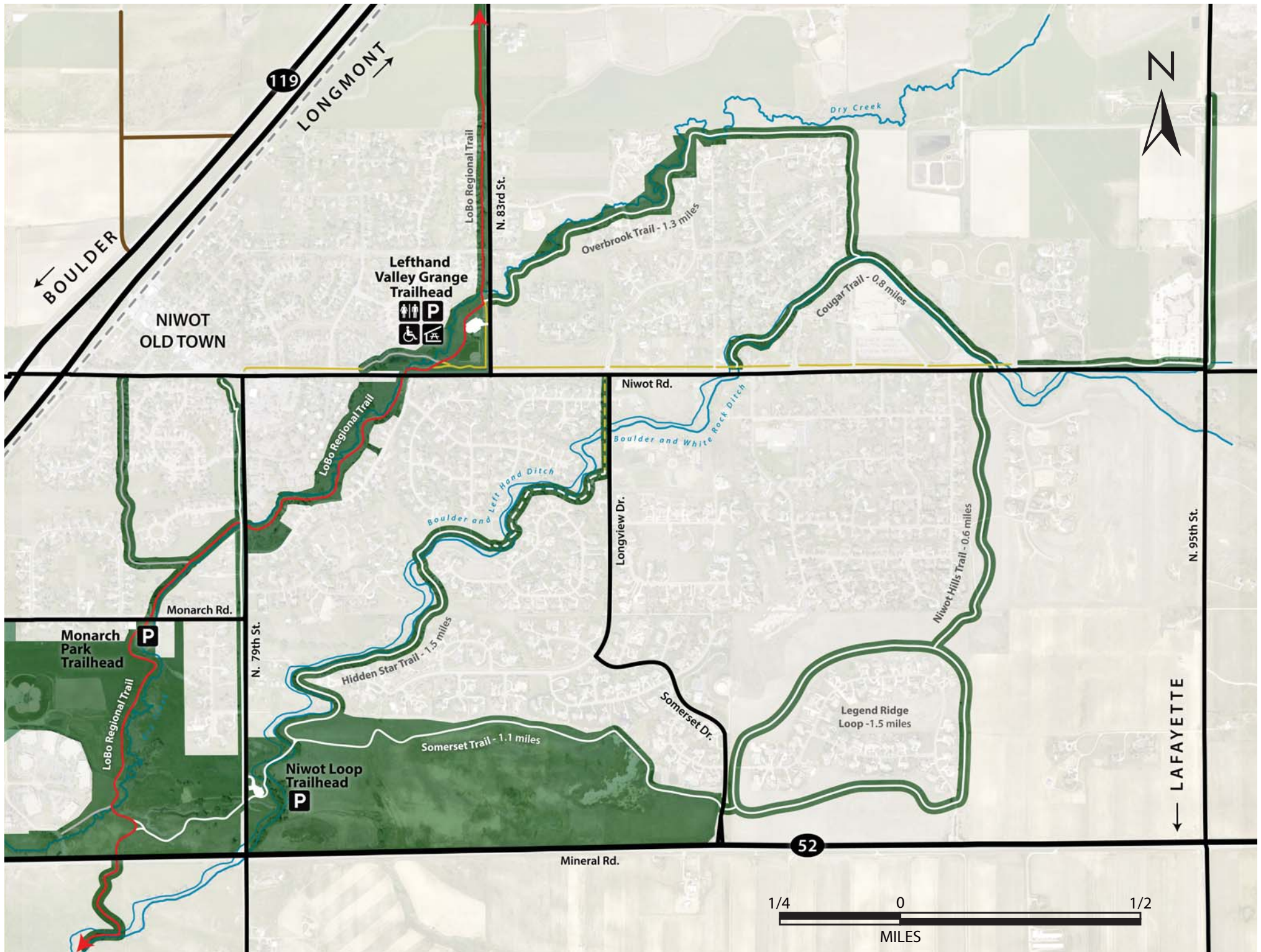

### TRAIL TIPS

- There are several areas where you need to use sidewalk connections.
- The Longmont-to-Boulder (LoBo) Regional Trail is open 24 hours per day. The parking lots and other trails shown on the map are open from sunrise to sunset.
- In addition to spectacular mountain views, this urban open space also provides a haven for wildlife. Look closely and you may spot a red fox along the creek channel or a Swainson's hawk soaring overhead.
- Keep your dog on a leash since unleashed dogs can bother other park visitors and increase the risk of fights with other dogs.
- Clean up dog waste to keep the plants and watershed healthier, and to keep other trail users from smelling or stepping in it.
- Stay on the designated trail because private property borders the trail system in several places.
