

Boulder County is aging





Low Income Seniors & Housing

Poverty Increases with Age

Seniors Living at or Below Poverty Level in Boulder County



6 percent of the county's elderly (3,600 seniors) have below-poverty-level incomes, <66% area median income.

Many more seniors are in the 70-120% AMI bracket – little support.

Surveying seniors: Quality of Life

Compared to National average

91% rate BoCo as excellent/good place to live.



90% likely to remain in BoCo through retirement.

Surveying seniors: Housing

40% have minor-to-major problems maintaining their homes/yards.

33% rate variety of housing options in Boulder County as "positive".

13% feel there is excellent or good availability of affordable housing.

1 in 5 have had problems finding housing to suit their needs.





Figure 5: Length of Residency in Boulder County




Figure 6: Likelihood of Remaining in Boulder County throughout Retirement


How likely or unlikely are you to remain in Boulder County throughout your retirement?

- Attention to lighting



Forces Impacting Affordability in Boulder County: NIMBYism

- N ature will be damaged
- Increase in traffic and crime
- Much too many units
- Bears use the area as a trail
- You should build it somewhere else

"The elephant in the room is NIMBYism" — the neighborhood opposition that often emerges whenever local governments and developers propose actual sites for affordable-housing projects. Residents of those existing neighborhoods and nearby property owners frequently will say they agree with the need for affordable housing but that it should be located elsewhere."



Boulder County Aging Advisory Council

The Aging Advisory Council (AAC) advises the Board of County Commissioners and BCAAA on matters affecting older adults and family caregivers.

The AAC Housing Committee's mission is learning and advocacy for Senior Housing

- We identify projects in the County that would benefit seniors and decide if we can meaningfully contribute to their success
- We advocate as individuals to the press and to planning boards
- We support the efforts of Boulder County Housing Authority and Boulder Housing Partners in their efforts to provide affordable housing
- As citizens we need to:
 - Be aware of affordable housing development plans
 - Undertake principled lobbying in support
 - Letters to the press
 - Emails to elected officials and planning authorities
 - Attendance at Planning Meetings



Boulder County Regional Housing Partnership

- Multiple agency working group studying affordable housing shortages
- Goal = 12% of countywide housing inventory is affordable by 2035
- September Summit: elected officials from Boulder County, Boulder, Jamestown, Lafayette, Longmont, Louisville, Lyons, Nederland and Superior.
 - Longmont workforce housing issues
 - Louisville workforce housing issues
 - Nederland workforce and geographic isolation
 - o Lyons flood recovery
 - o Boulder housing diversity to meet all needs
 - Lafayette housing burden is too high, leaving residents vulnerable
