



2019 BCHA Budget Goals

1) Maximize new Housing Choice Voucher Dollars

• Successfully deploy \$1.6M in new Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) funds

2) Development Pipeline

• Continue to work on potential development projects that support the Regional Housing Strategy and increase affordable housing stock.

3) Stabilize Housing Property Operations

• Create efficiencies with structural changes within the maintenance department

4) Capital Development / Asset Protection

• Implement a capital development plan that prioritizes health and safety projects to protect the portfolio



2019 Assumptions

Maintain current funding levels for federal programs

Low to moderate rent increase expected Jan 1, 2019

95% occupancy rate (93% for LIHTC properties)

3% payroll expense increase

BCHA expenses for LIHTCs are fully reimbursed

Grant programs are budget neutral



2019 Significant Changes

\$1.6M additional funding for Housing Choice Voucher

Focus and streamline BCHA operations and integrate weatherization staff into maintenance operations


Focus on Regional Housing Strategy and critical programs, accordingly the following programs will no longer be administered by BCHA:

- Tenant Based Rental Assistance
- City of Boulder rehabilitation program
- Revolving Loan program
- Weatherization

Flood mitigation assistance (CDBG-DR) concluded






BCHA Operating Fund 2019 Budgeted Expenses

- Other Rent, Training, Supplies, \$902,177 Phone, Printing, Legal
- Depreciation (& other non-cash) \$744,579
- Salary & Benefits (non-maintenance) \$753,417
- Interest Expense \$555,830
- Indirect Non-Labor costs \$344,585
- Utilities \$337,784


