Voting your ballot and signing your envelope

1. Read all the instructions on your ballot and vote using a black or blue ballpoint pen.
Do not sign, initial, or print your name on the ballot.
2. Refold your voted ballot and place it into your return envelope (**your name is pre-printed on the return envelope***).
Only put your own ballot in your return envelope. If you include another voter's ballot, none of the ballots will count. And make sure not to switch envelopes with anyone else in your household.
3. Seal** and sign the envelope. By law, your signature is required on the Official Return Envelope, so you must sign the affirmation on the envelope. Your ballot will not be counted if your signature is missing. All signatures are verified.

Correcting a Mistake

- If you make a mistake on your ballot, it is recommended that you request a replacement (see below).
- If there is insufficient time to request a replacement ballot, then change or correct a selection by:

Fill in the oval of your choice. CHOICE A
Draw a line through the choice you did not mean to choose. ~~CHOICE B~~

Returning your ballot

Ballots are due by 7 p.m. on Election Day – Tuesday, November 2, 2021.

Drop-Off: No postage required at Ballot Drop-Off Boxes or Vote Centers (locations on back).

Mail: We recommend mailing your ballot no later than by Mon, Oct 25, 2021.
Postmarks do not count. Affix adequate postage, see our website for postage FAQs.

Replacement ballots

- **Replacements by mail:** Contact us no later than Mon, Oct 25, if you would like a replacement ballot mailed to you.
- **Replacements in-person:** Use our Ballot-to-Go service or visit any Vote Center by 7 p.m. on Election Day, Tues, Nov 2 to request a replacement ballot.

Additional information

- **Track your mail ballot** by signing up for Ballot Track. You can opt to receive text, email, or phone messages when your ballot is mailed to you and received by Boulder County for processing. This is a free service. Sign up for Ballot Track at www.BoulderCountyVotes.org.
- If you are voting for a write-in candidate, the candidate must be from the certified list of write-in candidates for the vote to be counted. Visit www.BoulderCountyVotes.org for the list.
- You are not required to vote for every contest. Your ballot will still be counted.
- ADA accessible voting machines are available at any Vote Center.
- All valid ballots are counted in the same manner, regardless of the outcome or closeness of any race.
- It is a violation of law to receive more than ten ballots for mailing or delivery in any election.

Combating Election Mis- and Disinformation

The 2020 election saw unprecedented levels of mis- and disinformation. National and state election experts expect that trend to continue. Boulder County Elections works to counter false and misleading information, but we need your help. Here are some tips to stay educated and help combat election mis- and disinformation:

- ✓ **Be aware.** Remember, nefarious actors are spreading disinformation on social media and elsewhere to divide Americans and decrease our trust in elections.
- ✓ **Use trusted sources.** Check our website, contact us, or visit www.GoVoteColorado.gov for accurate information on registering, voting, and results. We are your fellow Coloradans, part of your community, and work hard to run elections.
- ✓ **Think before you link.** Verify that election related news stories or social media posts are accurate before sharing or liking. If you are not sure, check trusted sources.
- ✓ **Spread the word.** Encourage family and friends to use trusted sources to get their election information and let them know disinformation is being spread on the electoral process.
- ✓ **Understand how elections are conducted.** Explore our election security website section for the facts on the election process, view our education videos, read our Election Security Community Briefing, or come to a presentation or ballot processing center tour (events/tours are listed on our website or in our voter emails).
- ✓ **Update your voter registration record with an email address.** If you don't already get our voter emails (separate from Ballot Track), update your voter registration at www.GoVoteColorado.gov with an email address. Email addresses are never shared with campaigns and we only email voters during active election periods (typically 4-5 times total in the two months prior to Election Day).
- ✓ **Report false or misleading social media posts and other misinformation.** Boulder County Elections has a dedicated hotline and email to report mis- and disinformation. Information at www.BoulderCountyVotes.org.
